COLLEGE PREP ENGLISH

- Core text levels of complexity <u>align</u> to the recommended levels for the particular grade level as outlined by the NJSLS for ELA.
- The majority of whole class text studies are read/discussed during instructional time.
- Course content is paced to provide flexibility and scaffolding to meet the varying needs of students.
- Various instructional supports are incorporated to provide tier 2 and tier 3 interventions for students who are in need of academic assistance. (ex. ICS, tiered support, looping)
- The ELA interventionist monitors the progress of student performance to provide supports for struggling learners.

HONORS ENGLISH

- Core text levels of complexity <u>may extend beyond</u> the recommended levels for the particular grade level as outlined by the NJSLS for ELA.
- Whole class text studies are discussed during instructional time with the majority of reading done outside of class.
- Course content is rigorously paced with considerable independent, out-of-class preparation for class activities.
- Students are expected to keep up to date on readings and assignments in order to actively participate in class discussions.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) ENGLISH

- Note: AP Level courses are considered college level courses and are approved by CollegeBoard.
- Core text levels of complexity <u>extend well beyond</u> the recommended levels for the particular grade level as outlined by the NJSLS for ELA.
- Whole class text studies are discussed during and outside of instructional time with the majority of reading done outside of class.
- Course content is rigorously paced with considerable independent, out-of-class preparation for class activities.
- Students are expected to keep up to date on readings and assignments in order to actively participate in Socratic discussions.
