MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Although the student code of conduct contains a listing of infractions, it is clearly intended not to be all-inclusive, since no list can be. It is also intended that the administration and/or the Board of Education have the power to administer discipline for any other offense which is in violation of what is deemed accepted standards of conduct for students in the Washington Township School District. The student code of conduct will be applied equitably without regard to race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, or a mental, physical or sensory ability or disability or by any other distinguishing characteristic.

School is a place where students not only learn about the rights and responsibilities of citizenship, but also gain valuable experience in appropriately exercising them. It is important to strike a balance between rights and responsibilities to contribute to the maintenance of a school environment, which is conducive to learning. This code of conduct has been prepared to specify the following:

- Acceptable behavior and unacceptable behavior
- Procedures to determine violations of rules
- Consequences for such violations
- Measures to foster a positive learning environment by restoring relationships

The school acts "in loco parentis," that is, in the place of the parent with respect to the supervision of a student's education and conduct while he/she is in school. This authority, and this code of conduct, extends to school sponsored functions at whatever location they are conducted. This also applies to events outside of school that negatively impact the school environment. Each student is guaranteed the right to be heard, have fair and consistent rules, and due process procedures. These student rights are accompanied by student responsibilities. Students are responsible to attend school and classes regularly, respect school property, fellow classmates, and staff, and to refrain from conduct that disrupts or threatens to disrupt the learning of other students.

The code of conduct has been developed to address the responsibilities of students to attend school and to attend classes, making fully clear the possible immediate benefits and/or long-term consequences of excessive absences, truancy, class cuts, and tardiness. The administration, through the Superintendent or his/her designee, and/or the Board of Education, reserves the right to follow different courses of action other than those listed. There are sometimes violations beyond the code. Unfortunately, violations can occur in the middle school setting beyond what is described within this Code of Conduct. When these violations occur, they need to be dealt with more severely because of the implications they can have for the safe, orderly operation of our school. Discipline may begin at a higher offense or be increased due to the severity of the action. These courses of action may include a review and/or hearing by the Board of Education with consideration for additional disciplinary sanctions, including without limitations, alternative educational placement, expulsion, and/or other discipline as appropriate under relevant law and regulation. In addition to or in lieu of any other disciplinary action taken, the administration reserves the right to have a Child Study Team evaluation conducted.

HARASSMENT, INTIMIDATION AND BULLYING (HIB)

The Board of Education prohibits acts of harassment, intimidation, or bullying of a student, staff member, volunteer, or visitor. A safe and civil environment in school is necessary for students to learn and achieve high academic standards. Harassment, intimidation, or bullying, like other disruptive or violent behaviors, is conduct that disrupts both a student's ability to learn and a school's ability to educate its pupils in a safe and disciplined environment. Since pupils learn by example, school administrators, faculty, staff and volunteers should be commended for demonstrating appropriate behavior, treating others with civility and respect, and refusing to tolerate harassment, intimidation, or bullying. The Washington Township Public School's Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying (HIB) policy is located <u>HERE</u>. Individuals may report an alleged HIB to any staff member, or by completing a pre-screening form located <u>HERE</u>.

RESTORATIVE PRACTICES

Restorative practice is a proven approach to discipline in schools that believe in relationships; restorative practice has been shown to improve behavior and enhance teaching and learning outcomes (Thorsborne & Blood, 2013). The following is a partial list of restorative practices that may be used when appropriate and when time and resources permit:

- 1. Student Reflection
- 2. Restore Relationships
- 3. Restitution or Repair
- 4. School Community Activities

The restorative practices when used are intended to achieve the following goals:

- 1. To Prioritize Learning
- 2. To promote mutual respect
- 3. To ensure that students take full advantage of their educational opportunities
- 4. To create a safe learning environment for all

In all situations that call for restorative measures, school administrators will implement restorative measures in consultation with the counseling team and (as appropriate or applicable) relevant teaching staff and/or members of the child study team.

STUDENT CELL PHONE USAGE

WTPS recognizes that cell phones have become a ubiquitous part of our society, including students at the middle and high school levels. However, we are equally tasked with ensuring a safe educational environment for our students and staff. Cell phone usage by students in school has become a concern for many reasons, most notably in using phones to take pictures/videos during the school day and inappropriately using social media platforms in a way that leads to conflicts and other behavior infractions. We believe that cell phones should be away at all times during the instructional day - "No cell, bell to bell." The infractions listed in this code of conduct are intended to hold students accountable for inappropriate and unsafe choices made while using their device. These infractions cover most, but not all ways in which a cell phone could be used inappropriately. Administration reserves the right to impose discipline as needed depending on the nature of the use or display of cell phones during the school day.

DISCIPLINE AND SPECIAL EDUCATION

Administration may consider any unique circumstances on a case-by-case basis when determining whether disciplinary measures are appropriate for a child with a disability who violates a school code of student conduct.

To the extent that they also take such action for children without disabilities, administration may, for up to ten school days, remove a child with a disability who violates a code of student conduct from his/her current placement to an internal or external suspension in consultation with the student's case manager.

Once a child with a disability has been removed from his/her current placement for more than ten school days in the same school year, the district will determine if the behavior is a manifestation of the student's disability. If the behavior that violated the student code of conduct was not a manifestation of the child's disability, administration may apply the disciplinary procedures to that child with a disability in the same manner and for the same duration as it would to children without disabilities. If the behavior is a manifestation of the student's disability, the disciplinary action cannot be imposed by district administration. Administration must determine if the student needs a functional behavioral assessment, behavioral intervention services and modifications, which are designed to address the behavior violation so that it does not happen again. The child's IEP Team shall determine if the student needs an interim alternative educational setting. The student will receive educational services, participate in the general education curriculum and progress toward meeting the goals set out in the child's IEP.

Note: An * indicates that the violation is found on more than one tier level.

Note: Teacher notification will occur as necessary.

Tier 1: Minor Infractions

Detentions may be lunch or after school at administrative discretion.

Parent contact in this tier will be initiated by Teacher/Administration depending on the infraction

Administration reserves the right to recommend additional disciplinary sanctions, including without limitations, alternative educational placement, expulsion, and/or other discipline as appropriate under relevant law and regulations.*
