- Fully accredited by the New Jersey Department of Education
- Founded in 1962, our high school is the largest in Gloucester County
- One of the largest K-12 school districts in the Delaware Valley
- Dual credit earned through Camden County College, Rowan College of South Jersey, and Stockton University in a variety of courses

- **Advanced Placement** – Ten additional points to the final course average
- **Honors** – Six additional points to the final course average
