Basic Information

- Grades 9-12, enrollment 2,100, senior class 522
- Fully accredited by the New Jersey Department of Education
- Founded in 1962, our high school is the largest in Gloucester County
- One of the largest P-12 school districts in the Delaware Valley
- Dual credit earned through Camden County College (50 courses), Rowan College of South Jersey (1 course), and Stockton University (4 courses) in a variety of subjects

Note: From September 2020 to June 2021, student schedules fluctuated between full time remote, hybrid, or in person.

Community

- Located in Gloucester County, approximately fifteen miles southeast of Philadelphia, PA and 50 miles northwest of Atlantic City, NJ
- Suburban residential – Population of 49,000
- Culturally diverse, middle to upper class community, comprised of people who are employed as executive, professional, technical/trade experts

- College Board Advanced Placement Honor Roll status in 2013, 2016, and 2017

Rank

The weighted ranking system has two tiers used for ranking purposes and grade point averages

- **Advanced Placement** – Ten additional points to the final course average
- **Honors** – Six additional points to the final course average
- **Class Rank** – District policy not to report
