Dual Credit versus Advanced Placement

High School Plus Program (Dual Credit):

Washington Township High School and Camden County College (CCC) have an agreement for a variety of college level courses where students can earn college credits while still in high school.

- Application process – Every Fall through the classroom teacher
- Only one required application no matter how many courses a student is applying for
- CCC typically charges one credit worth of tuition for each course - 2016-17 = \$150.00 per course
 - Checks are made payable to *Camden County College*
- A minimum grade is assigned in order to earn dual credit - Refer to application
- Students can begin requesting transcripts from CCC to be sent elsewhere in July, if necessary

AP Courses and AP Exams:

Washington Township High School offers a variety of Advanced Placement (AP) courses in English, Fine Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Sciences, and World Languages. Enrollment in AP courses is based on course/department prerequisites.

- All AP courses are full year classes and weighted with an additional 10 points on a student's transcript
- CollegeBoard AP Exams are held in May
- Scores vary from 1-5, 5 being the highest score
- Students register for AP Exams in the Winter via their Naviance account
- The district will reimburse you a percentage of the \$93. exam cost based on the result your child's scores for a 3, 4, or 5
