We will also continue to do the Literacy Lab IDR reading log online in the Class Notebook. I'd like to phone conference with your children, so we will figure out a way to schedule that. Maybe you have ideas? I was thinking of using collaboration space in Class Notebook and having your children schedule time slots. Feedback for this would be VERY helpful. PLUS, I miss your kiddos SO much; it'll be nice to talk to them!!

For science, we will experiment with using the digital text and "worksheets" in Class Notebook. I'm exploring some options for investigations such as MY demonstrating in Flip Grid to resources such as MysteryScience.com.

Mrs. Alcavage will take over Mindfulness and Health and utilize Class Notebook in addition to some other resources. I know she's shared a Flip Grid as well. Be on the lookout!!

We are also requesting that first thing, when all the plans have been uploaded (our window is between 8:00-9:00 AM) you have your child write his/her assignments into the PTO provided assignment book. All the way to the right of each row for each subject is a completion box. Once the work for that subject is done, your child can check it off. I'll also provide a printable check list if you'd like that.
