Dear WTHS Families:

The NJSLA assessments for English Language Arts (ELA) for all 9th and 10th graders and Mathematics for any 9th and 10th grade students enrolled in Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, Foundations of Algebra I, Foundations of Geometry or Foundations of Algebra II, will be administered on **Monday, April 15th through Thursday, April 18th**. Students will be administered a unit of Math on April 15 & 16 and a unit of ELA on April 17 & 18.

Any Junior still in need of a passing score for graduation will be scheduled to sit for the NJSLA assessments for which they still have not achieved a passing score. These students will be notified of their testing requirements in a separate letter. More information on testing requirements can be found at: https://www.state.nj.us/education/assessment/parents/GradReq.pdf.

All 11th and 12th grade students must report to school in time for homeroom as per the schedule below. The district will provide busing for these students. If taking the late bus to school, students should be at their bus stop no later than 9:25 a.m. each morning. Please be patient as the buses are running on an altered schedule for these days. Students arriving prior to homeroom should enter the building through the 11/12 auditorium doors (labeled B13) and report directly to the 11/12 auditorium.

Due to this adjusted bell schedule, if seniors who normally leave after 6th or 7th period, leave at the corresponding time on these days, they would miss four days of instruction in their last scheduled class. For this reason, all seniors MUST stay in school until the end of their last instructional class on each of these days. We appreciate your help in reinforcing this important message.

If your child is testing, please remind them to bring their charged laptop and their charging cords to school on each testing day. Most students will test in their normal homeroom; students testing in alternative rooms will receive information regarding their testing room the week prior to testing.
