

No more "Golden Tickets" Renaissance card holders exam exemptions eliminated

The WTHS Renaissance program has lost what is probably its most prized reward, final exam exemptions. In past years, Renaissance members were entitled to opt out of the final for any class in which they received a 93 average for each marking period. Gold card holders were allotted two subjects, and blue card holders received one. But now, the school administration along with a committee made up of teachers, department heads, and other WTHS staff have passed a policy that will revoke this exemption.

Assistant Executive Principle of the 11/12 building, Mr. Joseph Bollendorf, said that the decision was "pretty much unanimous."

Though this policy may be suitable in the eves of the committee, many students were dismayed to learn of this new rule.

"It's absurd," said Matt Griechen '10. Many students share his feelings. This policy not only revokes the exemption but also changes the percentage that the final exam will play in the final grade. 



Lest we... um... forget? Impact of 9/11 may be fading with younger students Nicole Heath '10

Friday night at WTHS's first football game vs Cherry Hill West numbers of giggling students were puzzled as to why they were being quieted and told to face the flag by parents and teachers. Students either didn't remember it was the eighth anniversary of the World Trade Center attacks or simply didn't care.

People noticing these patterns of behaviour are starting to believe that 9/11 may be becoming just another event in the history books and that the severity and the momentous impact that Tuesday had may be forgotten as younger students come through the door.

The freshmen, class of 13', were only in second grade when 9/11 occurred. Some freshmen say they still remembered the day, but at that time lacked the understanding of what was really happening.

Films such as *Fahrenheit 9/11* and *World Trade Center* have been made documenting that day, and shows such as Rescue Me try to capture post September 11 feelings. This can change the way students remember and respect the day.

"Their memory isn't going to be of that day," said Gorski, "but of what they heard."

US History teacher Mr. Dan Saia believes the same and that many students, "take the lead from their parents."

For some it is not suprising that, with many outside influences and few actual memories to recall. younger classes don't have the same respect for the day. However, teachers and students alike agree that the impact of the attacks should never be lost to future students.

"We study the past to understand the present," said Saia, "[We] need to take the time to reflect on how our lives changed."

"It's an unforgettable event," Scarpinato said. Gorski agrees, "We need to move forward but we cannot forget the past."

He believes that, regardless of age or lack of first hand knowledge, students need to realize that those who lost their lives, especially the heroes of that day "can never be forgotten."
