Coaching legend retires after 39 years | Football

First known as a gym teacher in 1971, entering a new soccer program at age 22. Now known as a lasting coaching legend at Washington Twp.

Times have changed.

Patterson-who has been the only soccer coach in WTHS's history—retired this past April. Compiling a record of 380-250-70 over 39 seasons, Patterson led the Minutemen to four conference titles in 1979, 1983, 1994, and 2007.

Although he had many illustrious seasons, 2007 was his most successful one. The Minutemen won the South Jersey title, backed by goalie Kevin McMullen '07 and midfielder Dwavne Dove '07.

"It was the first time in school history that we ever won. That was Patterson told *The Patriot* before the one of my top moments as a coach," 2009 season.


