The summer assignments **must be typed and are individual assignments.** **This means you CANNOT share and copy information with other students or plagiarize off internet resources.** All work that is copied will result in an automatic zero for all assignments in accordance to the school district's academic integrity policy found on page 9 of your handbook. **No written work will be accepted.**

Please read all directions on the charts carefully! **The first concept is done for you as an example on each chart, so please use it as a reference on how to complete the rest of the assignment to receive full credit.**

Grading:

This summer assignment will be graded using a set rubric and will count as 2 separate homework grades. Once the content from this assignment is reviewed in class, a major assessment in the form of a test will be given.
