
National Geographic Weird But True Facts




Remembering Roy Halladay **By: Hunter Smallets**

Save our Water

Do you know how important it is to conserve water? Well it is actually way more important than you would realize. The demand for water is growing meanwhile the world is losing some of our fresh water resources because people are wasting water! Only fresh water can be used to drink and for most of our household activities like taking a shower and washing our hands. Did you know that we only have a little bit of fresh water on the Earth? Well a LOT of that fresh water is trapped frozen in glaciers and polar ice caps. So, next time you use water try not to waste it and remember you could be saving it. Here are some examples of ways to help conserve our water.

- 1. Check to see if your toilet is leaking! To see if you have a leaky toilet, try adding food coloring to the water tank on the back of the toilet. If the food coloring disappears and you can see it in the toilet bowl, then you have a leaky toilet. This can waste up to 80,000 gallons of water per year! Do not wait to check, make sure you don't have a problem with your toilet!
- 2. Take more showers and less baths! When you go to get washed in the shower or tub, rethink taking a bath. Did you know you can waste up to 25 gallons of water while taking a bath, but taking a 5-minute shower only uses 10 gallons of water!
- 3. Try this car wash! Next time you go to wash your parents car do not use a hose! That could waste up to 60 gallons of water per minute if you leave your hose turned on when not in use. If you use a bucket of water and soap with a sponge instead, you only use about 5 gallons of water. Also, you should go to a Recycled Water Car Wash where they use recycled water. This helps save so much water to share and have.

Try using all these ideas. Be one of those people that are always helping out. Save Fresh Water.

Did you know that there were 1,509 tornados that took place this year, and the year is not over yet. Tornados are extreme weather that mostly take place in the Midwest, which is known as Tornado Alley, but they can happen anywhere.



Tornados are violent and dangerous funnel clouds that look

like an elephants trunk, that come to the ground. Tornados form from thunderstorms. They need warm, moist air from the Gulf of

Mexico and cool air from Canada. When these two types of air meet, they create the perfect atmosphere to make a tornado. Tornados are also called "cyclops" and "twisters". There is even a movie about tornados called Twister. I love it!
