In Ancient Rome on February 13 to 15, the Romans celebrated a feast of Lupercalia. Emperor Claudius II executed two men both named Valentine on Feb. 14, although on different years, in the 3rd century A.D. Their martyrdom (death) was honored by the Catholic Church with the celebration of St. Valentine's Day. Later in the 5th century, Pope Gelasius I combined the two celebrations! The poet Chaucer, in the middle ages, was the first to link St. Valentine's with romantic love.



5 out of 5 stars. It has lots of pictures and would be easy for younger students to read.










Snowy "Bomb Cyclone"

I love traveling to Europe and spending time at the shore.



Having to make tough decisions, even when they are not popular, is a tough part of the job. I am honest and direct which helps me to be a good communicator.







