Kindergarten Tours

On May 11th and 12th, Whitman hosted close to 50 new kindergarteners and their families to tour the school! On Friday, May 12th, I joined the tour to see what it was like. The staff involved in the tours were Mr. Anderson, Mrs. Gehringer, Mrs. Wesh, Mr. Clark, Mrs. Maxwell and Mrs.Heil. In the library, Mr. Anderson reviewed having kindergarten as a new program here at Whitman and said that "the kindergarteners make the place lively." After, Mr. Anderson reviewed safety and security with the parents. Some parent questions included, "How many kindergarten classes will there be?" "How many kids are in each room?" Mr. Anderson also asked the kids questions, such as the colors on the chairs, to see if they were paying attention and to see how much they know. Mrs. Wesh reviewed footwear and attendance policies. Mrs. Maxwell sang a song and got them to dance. Mr. Clark did a movement activity and then Mr. Anderson talked about our guidance counselor Mrs. Stumpf and our reading specialist Mrs. Johnson. Mrs. Gehringer discussed academics and building character within our Whitman family, she reviewed the OLWEUS program and Township Tuesday lessons/discussions, and mentioned developmental playtime in Kindergarten. Mrs. Gehringer read the poem "Books, Books, and More Books." When one student was interviewed, he said his favorite spot on the tour was the art room! After the students left, I had the chance to interview Mr. Clark about the tours.





I love chocolate! I have always enjoyed art and wanted to be a Disney animator when I grew up.


What do you do outside of school?:
