



WHAT ARE E-CIGARETTES?

- Battery powered vaporizer used to inhale liquid nicotine
- It heats the liquid, which produces the "vapor"




POTENTIAL HEALTH RISKS & CONCERNS

- Potential Health Risk
 - Nicotine addiction
 - Brain development
 - Increase risk for heart disease
 - Respiratory and eye irritation
 - Asthma attacks
 - E-liquid poisoning
 - Battery explosions
 - Popcorn lung
- Lacks Regulations
 - Online sales to minors
 - False claims or lack of evidence

E-CIGARETTES AS A SMOKING AID

- Can e-cigarettes help people quit smoking?
 - Evidence is insufficient
 - Currently 7 approved methods: patch, gum, lozenges, inhaler, nasal spray, Chantix,
 Zyban (Wellbutrin, Bupropion)
- Beware of dual usage!
 - Multiple studies find the using e-cigarettes may lead youth to start smoking traditional cigarettes
 - 65% of youth who had used an e-cig in the last 30 days also reported using another tobacco product in the same time frame.




WHAT'S IN E-LIQUID?

- Ingredients:
 - Nicotine
 - Propylene Glycol
 - Glycerin
 - Flavoring



NOT HARMLESS "WATER VAPOR"



- Labeling is NOT always a reliable indicator of nicotine content
- About 99% of ALL e-cigs sold at convenience stores, supermarkets and similar outlets contain nicotine.




THINK JUUL IS CUUL?

- WARNING: This product contains nicotine.
 Nicotine is an addictive chemical.
 - I Juul pod contains 0.7 ml with 5% nicotine by weight // approximately equivalent to about I pack of cigarettes (20 cigarettes)!
- CALIFORNIA PROPOSITION 65 WARNING: This product contains chemicals known to the State of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm.









NICOTINE POISONING

- 2014 AAPCC 4,024 calls
 - 335 calls a month

- Over half were children under age 6
 - Vomiting
 - Nausea
 - Death

- 2018 –3,146 cases
 - The Child Nicotine Poisoning Prevention Act





KA-BOOM

- Defective e-cig batteries have caused fires, explosions, and life threatening injuries
- Hundreds of cases throughout the US



BIG TOBACCO

- Bought out or share e-cigarette companies
 - Altria-JUUL
- Hiding behind new brands
- Pushed by tobacco companies as a socially acceptable, safe alternative to cigarettes
- Targeted toward youth and young adults
 - Hooked on nicotine early
 - Lifetime users





MARKETING


- Tobacco advertising ban 1970s.
 - Television and Radio
 - E-cigarettes not included

- E-cigarette advertising
 - \$6.4 million in 2011
 - \$115 million in 2014




NATIONAL MIDDLE SCHOOL RATES

- 5 out of 100 MS students vape e-cigarettes






NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL RATES


