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Title I and BSI Frequently Asked Questions

• What is Title I or BSI?

- Title I is a section of the federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), which is the current legislation derived from Elementary and Secondary Schools Act and No Child Left Behind from the early 2000s.
- Title I programs and funds provide students who may be at risk for academic or behavioral achievement due to a variety of factors including English as a second language, socio economic status, or below grade level academic achievement.
- \circ ~ Title I programs provide targeted assistance to mitigate any at risk factors.
- BSI is Basic Skills Instruction and mandated through Title I to provide that targeted academic assistance. This often includes extra teaching staff to focus on specific skills with students or supplemental instruction beyond the core content of instruction.
- Not all BSI is funded through federal funds. It depends on the money allocated if 40% or more of a school's student body receives free or reduced lunch.
- How was your child was identified for BSI services? What are the assessments we use? What do they mean?
 - All students in the district take the STAR test three times per year (grades 2-12) for progress monitoring purposes. The STAR is a norm-referenced, computer-adaptive test that is administered in both ELA and Math.
 - Any student that scores below average on the STAR test is screened for BSI services, including BSI Math, BSI ELA and Read180. BSI Screening data points include grades, unit assessment averages, and teacher recommendations. Read 180 uses one additional data point assessment called the SRI, "Scholastic Reading Inventory."

• How we will help your child meet state proficiency goals?

- Progress monitoring through Star/Renaissance (measures growth, identifies specific skill deficits), important that students take the test seriously/try their best so we receive accurate information and can best support them
- \circ Additional instructional time in reading/writing and/or math
 - Supplemental
 - Targeted, standards-based intervention
 - Working Lunch available with Miss Cooper (Grades 6, 8)
- What activities can you do at home to help your child succeed?

- PowerSchool
 - Check Homework Calendar with your child
 - Review grades weekly with your child
 - Have questions? Send an email to the classroom teacher together (parent and child)

 - To hear text read aloud, just copy and paste into the browser

 - Use to check a writing assignment to help your child find errors

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- Monitor your child's progress with IRB (Independent Reading Book)
- Sadlier Vocabulary Program (online) typically assigned on a Monday, students have multiple days to complete assignments, quiz every two weeks, unit tests are cumulative
- o Math
 - Digits most assignments, reviews, how-to videos, etc. found online
 - IXL.com skill-based practice by grade-level. First 10 questions are free to anyone, but your student should have an account if they are enrolled in Math Supplemental
 - Help your child become fact-fluent (+/-/x/÷) using apps on your phone!

• What if you don't have Internet to access the above support?

- Discounted internet Comcast
 - "Internet Essentials" (Application-based program)
 - \$9.95/month, no rental fees for router/modem
