Next meeting date...April 11

The meeting began with Dr. Gregor recapping the purpose of the coalition as well as the coalition's agreements. He set the goal for the meeting, which was to develop a consensus on our GPS or Grading Purpose Statement.

To assist with this process the coalition invited Dr. Tom Guskey, Professor Emeritus at the University of Kentucky. Dr. Guskey is one of the, if not the nation's leader in grading reform. He was trained under Benjamin Bloom who is the founder of Bloom's Taxonomy which sets the progression of learning and rigorous thinking in terms of pedagogy. Dr. Guskey has written countless articles and several books. His recent book, *Get Set, Go!* is the text used to provide insight as to how to embark on a journey of equitable grading practices.

From there, Mrs. Barnett discussed the three GPS suggestions that came out of the steering committee to be vetted by the coalition. The coalition debated the use of certain terms to help remove ambiguity. Dr. Guskey offered suggestions to differentiate between achievement and progress, goals and standards, and the importance of separately reporting non academic factors, which the coalition phrased, "Scholarly Attributes".

We narrowed the GPS down to a few clarifying statements, which will be brought to the steering committee and discussed in the coalition on April 11.
