


CLASS COUNCIL 6th GRADE

In addition to these units, the following behaviors are integral elements in the course: attendance, effort, working with others, etiquette, following directions, pride in work, self-discipline, respect for others, and attention to detail. Throughout the course, students will attend daily rehearsals, receive weekly lessons and attend periodic after school rehearsals. Students have the opportunity to participate in regional activities, perform at school concerts/assemblies, and at the discretion of the director, participate in selected musical festivals.
