## **SATs at Washington Township High School**

## Saturday, June 3, 2023

Here are a few reminders for students taking the SATs on Saturday, June 3, at Washington Township High School:

- Students must have a physical Photo ID! (A photo of the ID on a phone will not be accepted)
  - Acceptable photo IDs include:
    - School ID (from 2020-21 to 2022-2023 school years)
    - Government Issued Photo IDs such as:
      - Passport
      - Driver's License
      - Expired Government Issued Photo IDs will be accepted if they have expired within 1 year of the test date
- Students are allowed to bring snacks and water bottles but must leave the testing room to eat or drink.
- Students should bring their own number 2 pencils and CALCULATOR (testing staff will not have any to distribute)!
- Check-In begins at 7:30am- Students will be directed to the 11/12 cafeteria for check in. Students arriving after 7:50 may not be admitted if all check-ins have concluded.
  - Students should be dressed appropriately for weather conditions and varying room temperatures. To maintain social distancing, students may be asked to wait outside- we will only admit 20-30 students at a time.

- Face Masks are now optional at Washington Township High School.
- All students will need to agree to the following three statements at arrival. No student should attend
  the SATs if on a quarantine with their school. Contact the SATs to reschedule if so.
  - You do not have covid-19 or reason to believe you have covid-19. Symptoms of covid-19 include cough, fever, chills, muscle pain, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell.
  - You agree to follow the health and safety guidelines in place at this test site as instructed by testing staff.
  - By entering the testing room, you're accepting the risk of covid-19 exposure. While we have taken measures to help create a safe environment, unfortunately it isn't possible to remove all risk.
