Washington Township High School Football to Host Kingsway in Group V State Semifinal This Friday at 6 p.m.

WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP – The Washington Township High School football team won its second consecutive Central Jersey Group V championship last Friday, and now the Minutemen will look to advance to the state championship game for the first time in school history. WTHS will host Gloucester County rival Kingsway Regional High School this Friday, November 17, 2025, at 6 p.m. at Tom Brown Field in a Group V state semifinal game. General admission tickets for the game are \$6 for adults, students, and senior citizens by securing a digital ticket using this link from the New Jersey Interscholastic Athletic Association's HomeTown Ticketing website. The cost includes a \$1 processing fee per ticket. Please note: Tickets will be available at the gate for \$10, cash only. Children 5 and under are free.

NJSIAA complimentary passes will be accepted, and all active military and military veterans with valid identification will be admitted at no charge.

Gates will open at 5 p.m. All students in grades K through 8 must be accompanied by an adult to attend the game. WTHS fans should use the main front gate near O'Brien Hall to access the stadium. The Acme Gate near the baseball stadium is for visiting fans only.

Friday night's game will be broadcast live. That information will be released later in the week by the NJSIAA, which owns media rights to all state semifinals.

The Minutemen (12-0) defended their Central Jersey Group V title with a 38-7 victory over Old Bridge last Friday night, the school's fifth sectional crown. WTHS has won 12 games in a season for the first time. Kingsway (10-2) defeated Atlantic City, 38-21, in the South Jersey Group V final. It is the Dragons' third sectional championship and second in the last four years. The two teams met on Oct. 17 at Tom Brown Field in one of the games of the year in South Jersey, with the Minutemen rallying from two scores down in the fourth quarter to win, 39-36.
