



Dual Credit versus Advanced Placement

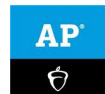
Dual Credit:



Washington Township High School offers dual enrollment agreements with [Camden County College](#) (CCC), [Rowan College of South Jersey](#) (RCSJ), and [Stockton University](#) allowing students to earn college credits alongside high school classes.

- ✓ **Application Process** – Start each fall and are facilitated through the classroom teachers and counseling office. Students need to submit only on application per college, regardless the number of classes.
- ✓ **Cost** – Colleges typically charge tuition equivalent to one credit per course. Fee waivers are available for students eligible for Free or Reduced Meals at CCC and Stockton University.
- ✓ **Minimum Grade Requirement** – Each course's application specifies the required grade.
- ✓ **Final Transcripts** – Students need to request transcripts from CCC, RCSJ, or Stockton University to be sent to their attending college by July. Check www.njtransfer.org > STUDENTS > Find Course Equivalencies – Research where credits are transferrable in NJ.

College Board Advanced Placement (AP) Courses and Exams:



Washington Township High School offers a variety of AP courses in English, Mathematics, Science, Social Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, and World Languages. Enrollment is based on recommendations listed in the WTHS Program of Studies.

- ✓ **AP Courses** – These are full-year classes weighted with an additional 10 points on a student's transcript.
- ✓ **AP Exam Registration & Payment** – Registration and payment are conducted via Total Registration from September to November. Free and reduced Meal students can apply for a College Board waiver but are not eligible for district reimbursement.
- ✓ **AP Exams** – Exams are held the first two weeks in May.
- ✓ **Scoring** – AP Exam score ranges from 1 to 5, with 5 being the highest.
- ✓ **District Reimbursement** – The district reimburses a percentage of the \$98 exam cost based the student's scores of a 3, 4, or 5.
