### Dual Credit versus Advanced Placement

#### **Dual Credit:**

Washington Township High School has an agreement with Camden County College (CCC), Rowan College of South Jersey (RCSJ), and Stockton University for a variety of college level courses where students can earn college credits while still in high school.

- Application process begins each Fall through the classroom teacher and Counseling Office
- Only one required application per college no matter how many courses
- Colleges typically charge one credit worth of tuition per course
- A minimum grade is assigned in order to earn dual credit – Refer to the dual credit application
- Students can begin requesting transcripts from CCC, RCSJ or Stockton University to be sent to their attending college in July

#### **Advanced Placement (AP) Courses and Exams:**

Washington Township High School offers a variety of AP courses in English, Fine and Performing Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Sciences, and World Languages. Enrollment in AP courses is based on course/department prerequisites.

- All AP courses are full year classes and weighted with an additional 10 points on a student's transcript
- CollegeBoard AP Exam Registration is held in October/November via Total Registration
- CollegeBoard AP Exams are held in May
- Scores vary from 1-5, 5 being the highest score
- The district will reimburse you a percentage of the \$95. exam cost based on the result your child's scores for a 3, 4, or 5
