Laptops

Laptops can be kept at home over the summer and used for summer assignments. Keep in mind that laptops are school property and need to be cared for accordingly. It is important that students avoid neglecting the laptop, keep it properly secured on a table or desk, and keep it at home. If you would like to get a head start and purchase insurance prior to the start of the school year, and if you are returning to BHMS in the fall, you can go to https://www.wtps.org/Page/23200 and download the form, complete and sign the user agreement, and have your child bring the completed agreement and \$65 check made out to Washington Township Public Schools. Return the form and check to Mrs. Venturo in the main office. If you are an incoming 6th Grader and haven't obtained your laptop, they are available to be picked up at Bunker Hill. Once you complete all the paperwork in the previous link, we would be able to provide you with your laptop.

Commemorative Bricks

During the Summer of 2018, our courtyard was renovated as part of an Eagle Scout project from one of our former students who is now a high school junior. We renamed the courtyard "Bulldogs Backyard". In this backyard, we built a mulch path as a temporary path with the idea of having it lined with bricks eventually, and those bricks would be a celebration of Bulldogs and Bulldog families. We are launching a

fundraising effort with the support of the PTO and in conjunction with the high school. Students at the high school will be formatting the engraving of the brick and our students in our Courtyard Construction Club will learn how to lay and space the brick. Middle School Athletics

It is also mandatory and vitally important that all athletes at the middle level have a physical form to give permission to play in a sport. Without the physical, state rules don't allow a person to even practice. To obtain the necessary paperwork for the physicals, please go to https://www.wtps.org/Page/22545. This will be updated throughout the summer. Make sure you work to get the sports physicals completed by end of July at the very least at the time of tryouts. There are no exceptions. All athletes need this completed. Try to get them in as early before your season as possible. The form must get to the school, then given to the nurse, then to the district physician. While we try to rush that, it can take up to 2 weeks.
